Dear WDS Members,

Welcome to the Washington Daffodil Society bulb order for 2018. This year our focus has been on offering show/ribbon winners both in the U.K. and here in the colonies.

WE ENCOURAGE YOU TO VIEW EACH OFFERING YOU ARE CONSIDERING ON DAFFSEEK.

We have reduced the number of "bulbs of the year" because there are too many that will meet the criteria!! Every bulb on our list is of

show quality and many will thrive in your garden landscapes as well. Most have been Gold (best of show) or White (best 3 of a kind) ribbon winners or in winning collections in the last few years!!

Explanation of classification and color coding: the number is one of 13 Royal Horticulture Society divisions -- 1 is trumpet, 2 is large cup, etc. The letters indicate color; perianth color follows the division number, and the cup color beginning at the eye is shown after the hyphen. (Y = yellow, G = green, O = orange, P = pink, R = red.) The name of the originator and date of registration follow. Blooming time is signified as E = early, M = mid-season, and L = late.

- ALL BULBS ARE OFFERED SUBJECT TO CROP VARIATIONS.
- If you plan to attend the WDS meeting, your bulbs will be available so please DO NOT ADD POSTAGE. If you place your order through one of our valued garden club memberships, all bulbs must be sent to one address (Exception: If you are WDS individual members as well, this does not apply).
- We will not be able to deliver bulbs to other meetings.

- Most importantly, a May 15th deadline must be adhered to. Any later and we risk that our suppliers will have sold out of some of the choice bulbs. INTERMEDIATE OF THE YEAR: *COMMODORE PERRY* 1W-GPP (Reed, 2000) (E-M) Smooth, good substance and an enviable pink cup from the outstanding breeding program of Dr. Reed. \$9.00ea

TRIPLE CROWN WINNER OF THE YEAR: *MERLIN* 3W-YYR (M-L) **Show as a Div. 3...show as an intermediate...or show as a Classic!!** Winning ribbons and shows for decades. Recently reclassified as an intermediate. Everyone should have Merlin's magic. **\$4.00ea**

CLASSIC OF THE YEAR: *BANDIT* 2W-YYO (1966) (Brogden, 1966) (M) A cultivar re-discovered when the Classic classification was approved. Competes with today's best! **\$11.00ea**

HISTORIC OF THE YEAR: *DAPHNE* 4W-W (Culpin, pre-1914) (L) Several ADS & WDS members requested that we find and list this sweetie, so here it is!! Ribbon winner for over a century!! (we think!) \$6.00ea.

Little Gem 1Y-Y (Gerritson, 1959) (VE) A neat little trumpet from New Zealand. **Minnow** 8 W-Y (Gray, 1962) (M) A 2017 white ribbon winner, an elusive Miniature Division 8!

Segovia 3W-Y (Gray, 1962) (M) Supplier calls this "our best all-around miniature." Multiplies nicely.

Twinkling Yellow 7Y-Y (Blom, 2010) (E-M) A 2017 white ribbon winner! 3-5 florets per stem

Cha Cha 6W-GPP (Duncan, 1986) (M-L) Pretty in pink; striking green eye.

Golden Echo 7WWY-Y(Heath, 2014) 1-3 bright florets per stem; useful color code Ice Wings 5W-W (Coleman, 1958) (M-L) One of the top Division 5's!

Fragrant Rose 2W-GPP (Duncan, 1978) (M-L) Arguably one of Brian's best achievements; beautiful flower with an amazing rose scent.

Snow Board 2W-W (van der Veek, 2013) (M) Outstanding substance and form.

Ambergris Caye 1YYG-Y (Pearson , 2001) (M) Offspring of Clouded Yellow carrying its smooth spade shaped petals and unique pale color. Eye-catching! \$8.00ea

American Shores 1Y-P (Havens, 1992) (M)A sun-proof second generation yellow-pink & sibling of American Dream and American Heritage. \$5.00ea

Foff's Way 1Y-O (Ron Scamp,2005) (M) Ron's hybridizing used Corbiere as the seed parent. Very useful for that extra punch in collections although the cup color may vary. **\$4.50ea**

Hermann 1Y-Y (Reed, 2011) (E-M) Smooth well-balanced blooms, strong stems, good pose. Consistent! "Perfection". \$14.00ea

Macdalla 1W-Y (Jackson, 2001) (E-M) A topnotch bicolor show flower from Tasmania that's hard to beat in its' class. Early blooming. Limited supply. \$12.50ea

Mariemont 1Y-O (Reed, 2014) (VE) An early long-lasting cultivar with a beautifully colored trumpet. \$6.00ea

Ombersley 1Y-Y (Postles, 1996) (M) We are giving this our own special award since it received more positive mentions than any other daffodil In the 2017 RHS yearbook. Super flower and consistently show quality. **\$6.00ea**

Smooth Trumpet 1W-Y (Wheatley, 1999) (E-M) Highest quality show flower. The name says it all! \$10.00ea

Trumpet Royale 1W-P (Duncan, 2013) New introduction by Brian Duncan and already winning at RHS shows. Gorgeous color, round and distinctive. \$28.00ea

Valley Moon 1YYW-Y (Crotty, 2000) (M) Very pale yellow blooms on strong stems with excellent pose! \$12.00ea

DIVISION II

Buttersilk 2Y-Y (Reed, 2011) (E-M) The name describes this flower perfectly. Please ignore the Daffnet photos!! You won't be sorry!! \$7.50ea

Cape Cornwall 2Y-YYO (Scamp, 1996) (L) A later yellow that won the Gold in this past year. The orange rim is very distinctive. \$8.00ea

Centenary Gold 2Y-Y (Scamp, 2012) (M) A big BIG winner in the U.K. last year. Pictured on the cover of the RHS Yearbook. \$25.00ea

Chelan 2Y-W (Evans, 1975) (M) Perianth segments sulphur yellow; corona near white \$6.00ea

Colin's Joy 2W-GWR (Crotty, 1989) (M) A requested and truly lovely flower. Smooth milky white perianth with a shade of green and white corona; a bright orange/red rim sets it off perfectly. \$6.00ea

Copper Mine 20-0 (Reed, 2011) (M) Treat yourself to a super quality cultivar! \$35.00ea

Great Joy 2W-P (Reed, 2012) (M) Almost a red trumpet. Will give you great joy. Vigorous! \$12.00ea

Homestead 2W-W (Pannill, 1972) A W-W you can keep from Bill Pannill. Still a winner. \$9 ea

Misty Glen 2W-GWW (Board, pre-1976) (M) This Wister winner and 2017 White winner is a splendid cultivar that keeps on winning. Long may it reign! **\$3.00ea**

Nowra 2W-R (Jackson, 1997) (M) A Gold winner last year in St. Louis. A Showstopper with its' frilled rim is super in a collection. Color may vary. Another Tasmanian gem. **\$5.50ea**

Nynja 2Y-Y (Jackson, 1992) (L) A very useful neat late bloomer from David Jackson. Cup is slightly darker yellow. Y-Y's are hard to come by later in the season. **\$6.00ea**

Maya Dynasty 2Y-Y (Mitsch, 1993) (L) Introduced by the Havens 25 years ago, it continues to succeed; 2017 White ribbon winner. Easy grower and multiplier & a useful late bloomer. **\$6.ea**

Modulux 2W-Y (Phillips, 1978) (M-L) Reflexed! Great to see it available again. \$7.00ea P

Pol Crocan 2W-P (Lea,1989) (M)Here's a mostly unknown gem that won big in the U.K. last year. \$9.00ea

River Queen 2W-W (Pannill, 2003) (M) One the judges' favorites. In 2017, it won gold in Kentucky and white in Ohio. Everyone needs Bill's whites in their gardens and they are getting harder to find. \$7.00ea

Tabor Hill 2W-P (Reed, 2009) (M-L) Cup is a distinctive orangey pink, corona has a slightly rolled lip. \$12.00ea

Terminator 2Y-R (Jackson, 1989) (E-M) Hot stuff! You can't be too rich, too slim or have too many Terminators!! Super color and great substance. A show bench stand-out!! **\$6.00ea**

Tropical Heat 2Y-R (Duncan, 1996) (M-L) Thanks, Brian, for such an elegant, smooth and stunning flower! It's a winner...again and again. \$9.50ea

Unchanged Melody 2W-PYY (Havens, 2007) (M-L) A great flower and useful color code for Throckmorton entries. Thankfully still available. An elegant and distinct cultivar. **\$9.50ea**

Veronica Brown 2W-P (Brown, 1999) (M) A scented New Zealand Pink. Rarely offered here. **\$11.00**ea

Yellow Ivory 1Y-Y (Reed, introduced 2013) (E-M) Ivory yellow corona. Has been Best in Show. Smooth and consistent \$8.00ea

DIVISION III

Al Laureys 3Y-R (Reed, 20009) (M-L) Recommended highly. Dr. Reed says it is "the finest small cup 3Y-R I have flowered." Daffseek photos do not do it justice. **\$12.00ea**

Armidale 3Y-O (Duncan, 2000) (L) The "WOW" factor!!! A very successful show winner in the U.K. Cross: Burning Bush X Triple Crown. Not seen here enough! **\$6.50ea**

Astrid's Memory 3W-Y (Postles, 2003) (M) The Gold Standard. A must for the serious exhibitor. Very limited supply \$17.00ea

Best Friend 3Y-YYO (Postles, 2001) (M) A round, smooth flower. Has won Best Bloom in the U.K. among many other awards. \$9.00ea

Clean Sweep 3W-WWY (E-M) (Nial Watson, 2012) Graceful and elegant show flower. \$17.00ea

Greenodd 3W-YYW (Nicholl, 1991) (L) A U.K. winner with great substance. Increases nicely. Rarely seen here (except in Scott's garden where it flourishes). \$5.00ea

Haunting 3Y-Y (Reed, 1999) (L) Hauntingly pale and very ethereal. Consistent! **\$7.00ea**

Little Karoo 3Y-O (Duncan, 1997) (L) Personal favorite of ours. A standout. \$6.50ea

Mesa Verde 3G-GGY (Spotts, 2001) (E-M) The pioneering green daffodil. WOW! \$18.50ea

Moon Shadow 3W-GYY (Postles, 1992) (M-L) A bright citron cup that does not fade. Parent of Astrid's Memory. \$10.50ea

Rosevine 3Y-WPP (Pearson, 2001) (L) Pastel coloring changes as it blooms. Richard Ezell's Gold Winner in 2017 so it must be good!!!!! \$5.00ea

Sabine Hay 3O-R (Milne, 1970) (M-L) When this was introduced the orange flush was a real showstopper and it still stops people in their tracks. Somewhat sun sensitive. **\$5.00ea**

DIVISION IV

Hibernian 4W-P (Duncan, 2006) (M-L) A tidy Duncan double and division winner. Part of Brian's hotel series. \$9.00ea

Dambuster 4W-Y (Duncan, 2006) (M-L) Brian's cross of Serena Beach X Serena Lodge \$9.00ea

John Daniel 4Y-Y (Scamp, 1993) (M) A banker in this division!

\$5.00ea

Kiwi Sunset 4Y-O (Hamilton, 1995) (M) An amazing little flower that is almost perfectly round. Striking color! \$6.00ea

Snowy Canyon 4W-W (Duncan, 2014) (M-L) A good sized show flower with broad back petals fronted by evenly stacked smaller petals. **\$19.50ea**

DIVISION V

Mission Bells 5W-W (Mitsch, 1984) (M-L) This Mitsch introduction would be perfect in a Havens Collection. 1-3 flowers per stem. \$4.00ea

Miss Lizzy 5Y-Y (van der Veek, 2016) (M) Already a top show winner overseas. 3-5 flowers per stem in golden yellow. **\$4.00ea**

Stint 5Y-Y (Mitsch, 1970) (M-L) A soft yellow flower with a corona slightly darker. It has been successfully shown and makes a lovely showing when planted *en masse*. **\$3.00ea**

DIVISION VI

Elizabeth Ann 6W-GWP (Duncan, 1983) (M) 2017 Gold and White winner, named by Brian for his wife, Betty. Lovely person; lovely flower. \$5.00ea

Peaceful Hollow 6W-O (Reed, 2014) (VE) One of the latest of John's work with Div. VI's \$12.00

Tracey 6W-W (Verry, 1971) (E) Mavis' popular early New Zealand export. From the same cross as Trena. Opens Y-Y but fades to W-W. Has been winning ribbons for decades. \$3.50ea

Trena 6W-Y (Verry, 1968) (VE) Mavis' cross with the same parentage as Tracey. This New Zealander's lemon-yellow cup holds its color. An ADS Classic with a classic Div. 6 form. **\$3.50ea**

Utiku 6Y-Y (Hamilton, 1993) (E-M) A consistent competitor from New Zealand that should be more widely grown and shown. **\$5.00ea**

Winter Waltz 6W-P (Mitsch/Havens, 1988) (E-M) Well, it wants to be pink, but not in the gardens we've heard from. Still, the trumpet has lovely shadings. The form is good and it offers a useful color code. **\$4.00ea**

DIVISION VII

Angof 7W-GYO (Scamp 1999) (M-L) Regular winner and sun-proof in the garden. Cup color varies. \$4.00ea

Dainty Miss 7W-GWW. (Mitsch, 1996) (M-L) Offered again by popular demand. Everyone should grow (and show!!!) The perfectly lovely little Wister winner. Only one charming bloom per stem is the norm for this classic. **\$4.50ea**

Kit Hill 7Y-YWW (Scamp, 1995) (L) We included this because we were keen to try it. Really soft watercolor hues. This jonquil was bred from Aircastle. **\$5.00ea**

Penstraze 7Y-GRR (Scamp, 2002) (M) Good show record in the U.K. Well-formed with good color (from parent Montego) 2 flowers per stem. **\$6.00ea**

Twinkle Gold 7Y-Y (Duncan, 2016) (M) We have been searching for a source for Regeneration for some time without success. This cultivar is from Brian's open pollinated Regeneration. Fingers crossed! \$9.00ea

DIVISION VIII

Fencourt Jewel 8W-P (Hall, 2003) (M) Re-offered due to early sellout two years ago. A gold winner in 2017. 3-5 flowers per stem. \$13.00ea

Koshare 8W-Y (Spotts, 2014) (M) Bright yellow corona;\$10.00 1-3 florets per stem. \$10.00ea

Motmot 8Y-R (Mitsch, 1979) (M-L) This American bred show winner is hard to find these days \$3.50ea

Pima 8Y-Y (Spotts, 2014) (E-M) Pale yellow perianth with deep yellow corona; 3-8 florets per stem \$13.00ea

Shalako 8W-O (Spotts, 2013) (E-M) One of Bob's best Division 8 achievements \$12.50ea

DIVISION IX

Angel Eyes 9W-GYO (Mitsch, 1976) (L) Grant Mitsch's American poet. Lovely green eye. \$4.50ea

Barr Hall 9W-GYR (Ballydorn, 1999) (L) Almost forgotten, but now available again. Worth growing. \$9.50ea

Greenpark 9W-GGO (Ballydorn, 1988) (VL) Another unique color combination: mostly green cup set off by an orange rim. \$9.50ea

Mountain Poet 9W-GYR (Mitsch/Havens, 1987) (VL) has re-emerged from one of our sources. Broad perianth segments; corona yellow with a green eye and a bright red rim. \$11.00ea

DIVISION XI

Crugmeer 11aY-O (Scamp, 2004) (M-L) Very broad yellow perianth segments backing a spreading orange corona. \$11.00ea

Diversity 11aW-P/W (Duncan, 1999) (M) What a beauty, like a watercolor painting. \$3.00ea

Jodi 11bW-P/W (Duncan, 2002) (M-L) A super star split. 11 cheers for Brian!! \$8.00ea

Maria Pia 11aY-R (Duncan, 2006) (E-M) Very consistent, successfully shown. \$7.50ea

Pampaluna 11aY-Y (Scamp, 2002) (M) A more restrained cup than most of this division, with the cup being slightly darker than the petals. Eye catching! **\$4.50ea**

DIVISION XII

Alyash 12W-Y (Pesterfield, 2017) (M) A new Division XII right out of the starting gate and available to you. Bred from Beryl with a unique color code and waiting to be in your collection. Bob says "Give it a try." \$7.50ea

DIVISION XIII

N x. Tenuior- (pre-1797) A jonquilla-poeticus cross, best grown in pots. Can be shown as a miniature. \$3.00ea

n. Bulbocodium conspicuus 10Y-Y "Hoop Petticoat" miniature yellow flowers with narrow petals and large corona; best in a wet position on acid soil. **\$2.00ea**

INTERMEDIATES

Bantam 2Y-YRR (Barr, pre-1950) (L) This "Classic" had renewed interest when intermediate classes were established. Frequent winner of Best Intermediate. \$4.00ea

Bonney Choice 3W-YYR (van der Veek, 2017) (M) A smooth winner from The Netherlands and finally affordable! \$10.00ea

Gold Pipe 1Y-Y (Duncan, 2013) (E-M) Consistently intermediate in size. Has smoothness and heavy substance. \$14.00ea

Signorina 2W-GYP (Duncan, 1993) (M-L) Very similar to its parent, High Society, but obviously smaller. **\$9.00ea**

Tom Terrific 11aY-O (Reed, 2007) (M) Really neat, dependable, colorful attention-grabbing split. A big winner in Baltimore recently. Limited number; first come, first served. \$16.00ea

MINIATURES

Angels Whisper 5Y-Y (Glenbrook, pre-1997) 3-5 whispering little florets per stem. \$5.50ea

Bird Music 1Y-Y (Frey, 1994) (VE) Golden yellow perianth and a long, frilled trumpet in a slightly deeper tone. **\$4.50ea**

Camborne 1W-W (Gray, 1995) (E-M) Bright yellow as it opens and fades to white \$4.00ea

Dainty Monique 5Y-Y (Dijk, 2000) (M) 2-3 flowers per stem tilting down in true Div. 5 fashion. Awesome! \$14.00ea

Gambas 1Y-Y (Gray, 1964) (VE) Vivid yellow perianth with corona slightly brighter \$4.50ea

Hummingbird 6Y-Y (Mitsch, 1975 A wonderful deep yellow cyclamineus with a nicely reflexed perianth introduced by Grant Mitsch. Super special! \$8.50ea

Little Sheba 6Y-Y (Reed, 2011) (E-M) Super streamlined. Very, very cool little flower. \$14.00ea

Medway Gold 7Y-Y (Pesterfield, 2007) Sweetly scented with one or two flowers per stem. **\$4.50ea**

Oxford Gold 10Y-Y (Blom, 2007) (E- M) Sweetly scented, vivid yellow, heavy substance; later than most bulbicodiums \$3.00ea

The Little Gentleman 6Y-Y (Nethercote, pre-1948) (M) Trumpet with flared curl, upward looking and very handsome. \$3.50ea

3 of Diamonds 3W-GWO (Gripshover, 1993) (L) Nicely round with a lot of color in the cup. Deep green in the throat with a ring of orange around the edge of the cup. Poet-like. **\$24.00ea**

Xit 3W-W (Gray, pre-1948) (M-L) From Alec Gray, pioneer of miniature hybridizing. Pure bliss! \$3.50ea

Yellow Xit 3Y-Y (Gray, 1968) (M-L) Similar to Segovia but much more difficult to find. Loverly! \$4.00ea

CLASSICS (1940-1969)

Bridal Crown 4W-Y (Schoorl, 1949) (M) 1-3 flowers per stem. Won a White ribbon in 2017. \$3.00ea.

Camelot 2Y-Y (Richardson, 1962) (M) A superior flower in its day. This Wister winner can still ribbon. \$3.00ea

Dallas 3W-GWW (Brodie of Brodie, 1942) (L) Charming flower; A little reflexed overlapping petals by half. \$6.00ea

Horn of Plenty 5W-W (van Tubergen, pre-1947) (M-L) Aptly named; 3 flowers per stem. **\$6.00ea**

Lemonade 3Y-Y (Richardson, 1959) (M-L) green-yellow perianth segments; good overlap. **\$5.00ea**

Lemon Drops 5Y-Y (Mitsch, 1956) (M-L) 2017 white ribbon winner. A flower that gives good vibes and gets ribbons in return. Not to be confused with *Dutch Lemon Drops*. **\$5.00ea**

Pueblo 7W-W (Mitsch, 1966) (M-L) Corona opens yellow becomes milk white. One of Mitsch's earlier successes. **\$4.00ea**

Stratosphere 7Y-Y (Mitsch, 1968) (M-L) Tall flower, 1-3 flowers per stem. Ahead of its time. **\$4.00ea**

Topolino 1W-Y (Gerritson, 1965) (VE) Can be shown as intermediate or classic. \$3.00ea

DIVISION XIII: SPECIES

n. Cyclamineus (pre-1850) Soooo tiny and soooo sweet! \$9.00ea

n. poeticus hellenicus A totally charming small poeticus. \$6.00ea

n. Rupicola 13Y-Y (pre-1830) Single, beautifully shaped. Can be spectacular! \$4.00ea

HISTORICS (Pre-1940)

Empress of Ireland 1W-W (Wilson, pre-1952) (E/M) Tougher than most W-W's and less likely to have basil rot...and yet a very good flower. If parent/child classes are of interest, it has 168 descendants!! **\$7.00ea**

April Queen 2W-YYO (van Deursen1938) (L) A brilliant beauty with its ruffled, flame-colored cup is long-lasting in your garden as well. \$3.00ea

Elvira 8W-YYO (van der Schoot, pre-1902) (M-L) Lightly scented, 3-4 flowers per stem. \$5.00ea

Polar Ice 3W-W (Lubbe, 1936) (M-L) This sweetheart is disappearing from the marketplace, but we've got it for you. Broad white petals surround a tiny ruffled cup that opens citron yellow and matures to white with a cool glimmer of spring green. **\$4.00ea**

Stilton 9W-YYR (Champernowne, pre-1907) (M-L) Can throw competitive blooms for the show bench. A distinctive canary yellow cup with a contrasting red rim. No wonder it's still around.

\$4.00ea

Trevithian 7Y-Y (Williams,1927) (M-L) Called a "refined modern Campernelle" when introduced in 1927. It still wins ribbons in 2017. It multiplies quickly, has a powerful aroma and a distinctive quill-like foliage. \$3.00ea
